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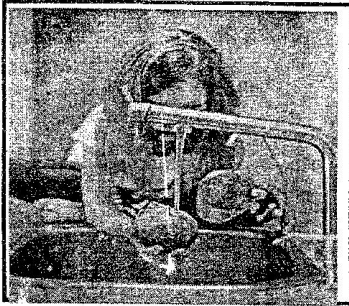


Read the passage below and then answer questions 6 - 9.

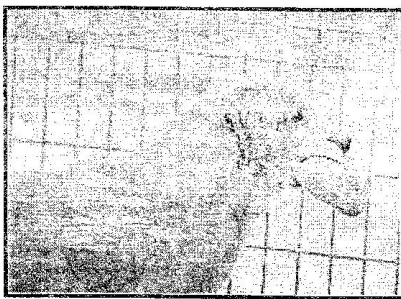
